

## Distribution of dissolved green-house gases (CO<sub>2</sub>, CH<sub>4</sub>, N<sub>2</sub>O) in Lakes Edward and George: Results from the first field cruise of the HIPE project

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Water samples were obtained in Lake Edward (n=14), Lake George (n=1), crater lakes (n=5) and rivers (n=25) during the first HIPE cruise (October 2016). Lake George and the crater lakes were strongly under-saturated in CO<sub>2</sub> and over-saturated in CH<sub>4</sub> owing to high phytoplanktonic production (cyanobacteria). Lake Edward was moderately over-saturated in both CO<sub>2</sub> and CH<sub>4</sub>. Rivers showed CO<sub>2</sub> and CH<sub>4</sub> within the range previously reported in Africa. All systems were under-saturated in N<sub>2</sub>O owing to sedimentary denitrification.





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
